The Lighthouse team works with the young person, housing providers and other organisations to establish or retain safe, secure and affordable housing, and to grow and connect with their local community. The program also aims to develop the young person's capacity to self-manage and access support independently.



We aim to create circles of safety around young people at risk of homelessness so that they are never without care and support.

We already have a Community Connect program operating successfully in the Northern suburbs of Melbourne. The program supports youth aged 16 – 25 who are experiencing any level of housing instability (such as risky tenancies and couch surfing). We provide outreach support, referrals, and items like clothing, food, toiletries and furniture.



We're here to give kids experiencing homelessness or trauma, the support they need to heal, grow, and achieve a lifelong sense of belonging.

The problem

- There are NO government-funded crisis accommodation facilities on the Mornington Peninsula.
- There are also NO government-funded agencies providing preventative case- management and links to housing support.
- 4000 Peninsula residents are on public housing waiting lists, and despite the urgent pleas for more public housing, and the support of council and government, it will take years for new buildings to be in place.



Young people living on the Mornington Peninsula are particularly at risk because of the lack of local affordable housing, issues of family violence and the need for mental health support.

There are very few support services for young people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness, and those that do exist report that they are overwhelmed and need help.

With their seed funding, Lighthouse Foundation will roll out our new Community Connect program on the Mornington Peninsula in 2023.

But we need more support to scale the program quickly to meet the growing need. We are hoping that others who have homes or businesses on the Peninsula, and the capacity to help financially, will join us.

While we can't entirely solve the issue until enough affordable housing is available, there's a great deal we can do NOW to help young people from being entrenched into homelessness.
